

The cost of inaction is high.








Financial flows

Now it is time to maximise impact for the Baltic Sea.


Ensure that there is long-term financing available.

enough pristine and wild marine and coastal areas acting as safe havens for animals and plants, and being removed from harmful human activities






Shadow Implementation Plan
